LIT2174	Literature of History of the Holocaust and Genocide	3	1, 2, 3,5,6,7	2009-3

**Course Description:** This courses explores the literary responses to the Holocaust and Genocide using a variety of texts including written, film, and propaganda/graphic arts. Students will learn the various literary techniques used to interpret these key world and historical events. Prerequisite: ENC 1101. (3 hour lecture)

**2. Biology, Health, and Wellness**

**Revised Course Description**

HUN1201	Essentials of Human Nutrition	3	1,2,3,5,6,7,8	2009-2

**Course Description:** The Essentials of Human Nutrition is a general education course designed to acquaint students with the specific role of carbohydrates, fats, proteins, vitamins, minerals, and water in daily life. Students will learn how the human body systems manage the breakdown, assimilation, and excretion of nutrients and their metabolic wastes. Students will also learn the relationships between food and optimal health including physical fitness and the relationships between nutritional imbalances and diseases. (3 hr. lecture)

EAP0430	Accelerated Inter. Spacking, Listening and Grammar	8	1,2,3,5,6,7,8	2009-2

**Course Description:** In this alternative course for EAP 0300, 0360, 0400, and 0460, students will learn intermediate grammatical structures necessary for participating in classroom discussions with an introduction to oral presentations and critical listening skills, emphasizing clarification, rewording and asking questions. Prerequisites: EAP 0200 and 0260 or appropriate COMPASS score. Co-requisite: EAP 0431.

EAP0431	Accelerated Inter. Reading and Writing	8	1,2,3,5,6,7,8	2009-2

**Course Description:** In this accelerated alternative course for EAP 0320, 0340, 0420, and 0440, students will learn to read texts on basic academic topics, expand vocabulary, and write structured academic paragraphs in various modes. Prerequisites: EAP 0220 and 0240 or appropriate COMPASS placement score. Co-requisite: EAP 0430.
