General Information

Public community colleges and universities in Florida award credit for IB examinations as designated by Florida Statute 1007.27. The chart below indicates how IB credit will be utilized at MDC. In accordance with the Articulation Agreement (March 1, 1971) between State universities and public community colleges of Florida, students transferring to a public senior institution within the State are assured that IB credit will transfer when earned as a part of a completed Associate in Arts degree. However, it is the student's responsibility to contact the senior institution if any question exists concerning the acceptance of IB scores.

All modern languages except English

International Baccalaureate offers examinations in many languages and literatures at different levels: B, A2, and A1. Most students in Florida take English as their A1 level languages (literature for native or near-native speakers) and one or more foreign Language B exams. Within each category, there are "standard" and "higher" level examinations.

** Language B (MOST COMMON)

IB diploma holders (standard or higher level) earn a minimum of one semester (3 credits) of language credit at the Elementary Language II or equivalent level (usually 1121) level for a score of 4. Diploma holders (standard or higher level) and non-diploma holders (higher level only) who score 5-7 earn a minimum of two semesters (min. 6 credits) of Elementary Language II and Intermediate Language I or their equivalents (usually 1121/2200) level. No literature credit is awarded for International Baccalaureate Language B exams.

*** Language A2 (language and literature courses for highly proficient speakers; uncommon in Florida)

No direct equivalent. Elective credits (3) are awarded for a language or literature score of 4 (Diploma holders only), 6 elective credits are awarded for language or literature for a score of 5-7 (all exams, standard or higher, for diploma holders; higher level exams required for non-diploma holders).

**** Language A1 (literature courses for native speakers; language other than English)

No direct equivalent. Elective credits (3) are awarded for a literature score of 4 (Diploma holders only), 6 elective credits for a score of 5-7 (all exams, standard or higher, for diploma holders; higher level exams required for non-diploma holders)

<u>Music (for score of 5 or higher)</u> ◆ Notes: Exam has music theory, history, and literature aspects. Emphasis is on post-Renaissance European music with significant additional coverage of alternating world music topics.	General Education Elective
<u>Philosophy</u> ◆ Notes: Course content is unlike most American university-level Introduction to Philosophy courses. Emphasis is on students' own philosophical skills rather than the philosophy tradition. Students select one major philosophical work on a given theme for Standard Level, two works for Higher Level. Higher Level students study two specialized topics and conduct three studies. Standard Level students study one specialized topic and conduct one study.	General Education Elective
<u>Social Anthropology (for score of 5 or higher)◆</u> Notes: All students study core topics and three or four cultures. Higher Level students have additional theoretical component.	General Education Elective
<u>Theatre Arts (for score of 5 or higher)◆</u> Notes: All students study core topics in dramatic literature, performance and stagecraft. Higher Level students do an independent project in a Theater Arts subject of their choice.	General Education Elective
<u>Visual Arts◆</u> Notes: Content will vary widely for each student. All students do both studio work and research notebooks. Standard Level students choose to emphasize one or the other. Higher Level students emphasize studio work. Courses in ART and/or ARH prefix may be appropriate.	General Education Elective
