General Information

Public community colleges and universities in Florida award credit for AP exams as designated by Florida Statute 1007.27. The chart below indicates how AP credit will be utilized at Miami Dade College. In accordance with the Articulation Agreement (March 1, 1971) between State universities and public community colleges of Florida, students transferring to a public senior institution within the State are assured that AP credit will transfer when earned as a part of a completed Associate in Arts degree. However, it is the student's responsibility to contact the senior institution if any question exists concerning the acceptance of AP scores.
