

## **FES 4003 - Public Policy in Emergency Management**

### **Course Description:**

An exploration of public policy used in emergency management, including how policy is made and conveyed.

### **Course Competencies:**

Competency 1: The student will describe the governance of emergency management by:

- a. discussing the Stafford Act
- b. discussing the role of FEMA
- c. discussing the role of TSA
- d. defining the role of the National Fire Administration

Competency 2: The student will analyze incident command systems by:

- a. defining Finance/Administration
- b. examining Logistics
- c. reviewing Operational
- d. discussing Planning

Competency 3: The student will develop a sample National Incident Command by:

- a. studying the history of Incident Command
- b. defining the theory of Incident Command
- c. exploring jurisdictions of Incident Command
- d. developing an Incident Command structure

Competency 4: The student will define the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) by:

- a. defining the mission and establishment of the DHS
- b. identifying the agencies which report to DHS

Competency 5: The student will analyze the National Response Plan, Florida and personal response plans by:

- a. identifying the needs for the plan
- b. defining components of the plan
- c. describing the development of the plan

- d. assessing the governmental role

Competency 6: The student will analyze the roles of organizations associated with Emergency Management by:

- a. comparing and contrasting non-profit and for-profit organizations
- b. citing and discussing examples of partnerships

Competency 7: The student will outline resources available for Emergency Management by:

- a. identifying private resources
- b. researching government resources
- c. exploring the role of professional consultants
- d. discussing local resources

Competency 8: The student will analyze financial aspects of Emergency Management by:

- a. describing insurance laws
- b. discussing government assistance
- c. defining government funding
- d. exploring and discussing non-profit organizations
