Course Description (limit to 50 words or less): This is a beginning workshop class covering narrative script writing for film and television. Working in a collaborative group environment, students will concentrate on developing a short-format screenplay and will learn three-act dramatic story structure, script elements, their applications and standard industry formatting.

- Indicating action in caps and present tense
