Course Description (limit to 50 words or less):

An introduction to the art and tools of narrative filmmaking. Students will learn industry procedures and protocols as well as visual storytelling and editing in the production of several silent Super 16mm films. Lab fee.

Pre/Co-requisite(s): FIL 2552C with grade of "C" or better.

Competency 1: Students will demonstrate proficiency in the use of the basic technical tools of narrative filmmaking by:

- Identifying and describing the components of the 16mm film camera
- Loading and preparing the camera for use under a timed scenario
- Identifying and describing the components of the light meter
- Performing accurate light meter readings under a variety of lighting situations

Competency 2: Students will follow industry-standard protocols and procedures in their work by:

- Integrating the basic crew positions of a film crew into a cohesive team
- Performing set cadence procedures

Competency 3: Students will integrate film components into their work by:

- Using a variety of shots (wide, medium, and close-ups)
- Structuring shots into sequences
- Creating dynamic visual compositions
- Making a selective use of rack focus

Competency 4: Students will complete visual stories by:

- Filming characters' clean entrances and exits
 - Selectively utilizing jump cuts
 - Observing the 180 degree rule
 - Integrating basic elements as identified in class
