Course Description (limit to 50 words or less):		
This course covers directing for film. Students will learn how to direct a film, from the pre-production stage through the shooting process and post-production, by producing individual short films. Prerequisite: FIL 1431 and FIL 2553C with a grade of "C" or better. Laboratory fee.

#### Competency 1: Students will complete the pre-production of a shoot by:

- Analyzing characters and writing character descriptions.
- Holding a casting session and auditioning actors in class.
- Preparing, with crew members, a script for production, based on industry standard protocols, written reports and documentation.
- Breaking down scenes into shots.
- Preparing shot lists and storyboards.

#### Competency 2: Students will direct the production of a shoot by:

- Shooting individual short film projects.
- Instructing actors in their roles.
- Organizing the work of the crew.
- Capturing the scenes needed to tell the story in a complete manner.

#### Competency 3: Students will organize the post-production process by:

- Logging and evaluating the captured footage.
- Identifying the footage in a coherent manner.
- Editing the movie by arranging and modifying the order of shots.
- Modifying the soundtrack of the movie through music, sound effects and dialogue.
