Competency 1: Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to describe the historical, theoretical development, current trends and challenges related to community health nursing by:

- b. defining the role of the nurse in the community.
- c. identifying evidence based practice as it relates to community health nursing.

Competency 2: Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to analyze the relationships among theory, evidence-based practice, and education as they relate to community health nursing in a global community by:

- a. relating public health concepts to practice and delivery of healthcare in the community.
- b. examining epidemiological concepts as they relate to global health.
- c. justifying the nurse's role as an educator, counselor, advocate and change agent in the community.

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Competency 3: Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to examine the effects of ethnicity and culture on the science and practice of community health nursing.

- b. explaining the concept of health care disparity.
