REA 0017 is an intermediate college preparatory reading course. Students will learn to build vocabulary skills, literal and critical comprehension skills, and successful reading strategies. Pre-requisites: Computerized Placement Test (CPT) or the Post-secondary Education Readiness Test (PERT). Lab time required. Laboratory fee. (2 hr. lecture; 2 hr. lab)

- 3. Distinguishing between major and minor details in a multi-paragraph selection.
- 4. Analyzing the author's primary purpose.
- 5. Analyzing the author's tone and support with examples, including denotative, connotative meaning, and figurative language.
- 6. Evaluating the author's use of facts and opinions.
- 7. Identifying relationships between and/or within sentences.
- 8. Detecting bias.
- 9. Using contextual clues and structural analysis to clarify meanings and broaden academic vocabulary.

- 10. Identifying and using contextual clues to determine the meaning of words in multiple sentences.
- 11. Determining whether an argument is logical, relevant, and adequate based on the evidence provided in a passage.
