

ASL 2510 DEAF CULTURE & COMMUNITY

Course Description

This course provides an in-depth study of the lives and experiences of deaf and hard of hearing persons. Information is given from the medical, educational, cultural, societal, and Deaf Gain viewpoint. Students examine deaf and hard of hearing persons' hearing loss and technologies; education and language development including signed languages; unique features of the Deaf community and community services; attitudes, ethnicity, identities, and demographics; and art and careers (3 credits).
