<ol> <li>recognizing and responding to a person in crisis while remaining respectful and impartial.</li> <li>identifying the criteria and action to take when interacting with a person who qualifies for services under the Baker Act.</li> <li>discussing how to safely intervene in a potential suicide situation.</li> <li>recognizing illnesses that mimic substance abuse and the stages of substance abuse and treatment.</li> <li>identifying the criteria and action to take when interacting with a person who qualifies for services under the Marchman Act.</li> <li>discussing how to transport a person in crisis as well as document the incident on the proper forms.</li> </ol>
