

Course Description

DAN2130 | Dance History 1 | 3 Credits

Study of origins and development of dance as an art form from its inception in primitive cultures to present. Fulfills Gordon Rule writing requirement.

Competency 1:

The student will develop a broad, comprehensive overview of dance-art forms in a global perspective from ancient, primitive dance to contemporary dance forms by:

- Identifying Historical perspectives.
- Describing Social implications (values and issues).
- Understanding Philosophical attitudes (political, ethical).

The Student will be able to identify major historical periods in dance and identify the individuals/artists who contributed to the development by:

- Tracing the development of dance from ancient times to the present.

- Presenting an in-depth description and critical evaluation of selected choreography.
- Identifying the major genres of dance and their significant contributions.

- Demonstrating a synthesis of ideas acquired through studying dance history relevant to opera, musical theater, and visual art.
