

Course Description

EAP0486 | Intermediate 2 - Integrated Reading, Speech & Listening | 6.00 credits

Students will learn to develop speaking, listening, and academic reading skills through discussions, presentations, and analysis with an emphasis on oral fluency, critical reading, and vocabulary expansion. Prerequisites: EAP 0300 or 0386, and 0320, or equivalent proficiency. Co-requisite: one (1) approved college level course.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate understanding of level-appropriate academic and other authentic materials by:

- 1. Discussing texts, including visual data, orally and in writing
- 2. Paraphrasing and summarizing texts orally and in writing
- 3. Predicting content
- 4. Using inferences
- 5. Extending text themes to personal experiences
- 6. Describing insights on topics
- 7. Integrating academic vocabulary into oral discourse
- 8. Inserting academic vocabulary into written texts
- 9. Recognizing cultural references and idiomatic expressions

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate improvement in comprehension while increasing their reading rate by:

- 1. Expanding vocabulary and expression through the study of parts of speech, antonyms, synonyms, roots, and affixes
- 2. Focusing on signal words
- 3. Using context clues
- 4. Distinguishing between main ideas and supporting details
- 5. Recognizing common patterns of organization
- 6. Differentiating between fact and opinion
- 7. Performing reading assignments under time constraints

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate application of content by:

- 1. Participating in discussions and preparing oral presentations
- 2. Performing role-plays and creating dialogues
- 3. Investigating outside sources to integrate into presentations
- 4. Developing and defending an argument
- 5. Applying critical listening skills

Competency 4: The student will develop academic speaking and listening skills by:

- 1. Articulating sounds accurately
- 2. Modifying volume, speech flow, and tone
- 3. Gauging audience for understanding
- 4. Asking and answering questions
- 5. Identifying main ideas and supporting details
- 6. Following multi-step directions
- 7. Adjusting to changes in a conversation and extending discussions

- 1. Applying note-taking strategies
- 2. Using notes for participation in class activities and for test preparation
- 3. Adjusting reading strategies to fit different assignments
- 4. Applying test-taking strategies and skills
