



### **Course Description**

#### **EAP1685 | Advanced 2 – Integrated Writing & Grammar | 6.00 credits**

Students will learn to refine essays by developing advanced grammar & rhetorical structures. Prerequisites: EAP1540 and 1560, or 1585, or equivalent proficiency. Co-requisites: one (1) approved college level course.

### **Course Competencies**

**Competency 1:** The student will develop level proficiency in academic writing in English by:

1. Composing multi-paragraph essays including comparison/contrast, cause/effect, and argument
2. Proofreading, editing, and assessing written work for accuracy, focusing on grammar, mechanics, sentence structure, and vocabulary
3. Integrating quotations, paraphrases, summaries, examples, and definitions from external sources into written work

**Competency 2:** The student will develop proficiency in grammatical structures in English by:

1. Recognizing, implementing, and producing grammatical structures that are associated with various rhetorical modes
2. Recognizing and implementing passive voice appropriately in academic writing
3. Recognizing and using verb tenses and modals appropriately

**Competency 3:** The student will develop proficiency in the correct usage of English sentence patterns and grammatical structures in writing by:

1. Recognizing and using clauses such as noun clauses as subjects or objects, including reported speech, adverbial clauses of condition, effect, cause, and contrast, and adjective clauses, both restrictive and nonrestrictive
2. Recognizing and using phrases such as prepositional, noun, and verb phrases (gerund, infinitive, and participial phrases)
3. Integrating past modals to express certainty, regrets, and conditions

**Competency 4:** The student will develop study skills by:

1. Using reference tools such as word processing, dictionaries, and grammar texts to edit writing and credit sources
2. Integrating technology and using EAP-designated labs/lab materials to refine computer word processing skills and online research in support of academic writing activities
