

Course Description

FIL2131 | Screenwriting 2: Character Development & Advanced Story Structure | 3.00 credits

In this workshop-style intermediate level course students will learn about character development and various story structures for narrative motion picture screenplays. Prerequisite: FIL1100.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: he student will develop characters for screenplays by:

- 1. Identifying character traits in screenplays
- 2. Examining character arcs
- 3. Applying character traits through written assignments

Competency 2: The student will understand various forms of story structure by:

- 1. Identifying story structure paradigms
- 2. Interpreting the use of story structure paradigms
- 3. Applying story structure for a screenplay through written assignments

Competency 3: The student will develop advanced screenplay format techniques by:

- 1. Analyzing various screenplay format techniques
- 2. Examining the use of formatting techniques
- 3. Applying advanced screenplay format techniques by writing a short-length screenplay
