 Identifying common accounts used to categorize the daily transactions of businesses. Define the characteristics of an account. Stating the rules of debits and credits and their corresponding accounts. Analyzing financial statments.

 Using data to prepare the three common accounting reports. Using date to complete worksheets and make adjusting entries. Making appropriate post-closing adjustments and reversing entries.
