HIM 1800 PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE EXPERIENCE 1

Course Description

This course will provide the student with a supervised professional practice experience in a healthcare setting, utilizing electronic health records and reports to manage health information data. Students will learn an in-depth knowledge of applying the minimum basic requirements for handling records imposed by regulatory agencies. Prerequisite: HIM 1000; Corequisite: HIM 1110, 1110L. (6 hr. lab/ clinic)
