HIM 2253C CURRENT PROCEDURAL TERMINOLOGY/CPT-4

Course Description

This course provides an in-depth knowledge of coding and reporting using Current Procedural Terminology classification. Students will learn to read and interpret ambulatory health record documentation to classify and assign services and procures codes and use of encoder and grouper software. HCPCS, APCs, and RBRVS will be discussed. Prerequisites: BSC 2085, BSC 2085L and HIM 2472. (1 hr. lecture; 2 hr. lab)

- 3. Examine ethical issues according to assigning CPT/HCPCS/ICD-10-CM codes
- 4. Creating quality reports using coded data

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
