Course Description

A supervised clinical practice in a health care setting. The student will perform coding of patient health records utilizing the International Classification of Disease, 9th Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-9-CM). Automated coding using the computer and encoding software is performed. Prerequisites: HIM 1110, HIM 1110L; Corequisite: HIM 2500L, HIM 2512C. (6 hr. lab/clinic)
