A Supervised clinical practice in a health care setting. The student will experience the use of specific motivational and communication techniques in health information supervision and the development of systems to meet the data needs of acute and ambulatory health care facilities. Applications in the use of basic health care definitions and data collection, analysis and display are explored. Prerequisite: HIM 2820; Corequisite: HIM 2512C. Special fee. (6 hr. lab/clinic)
