

Course Description

HSC 3655 | Theoretical Foundations of Health Care Ethics| 3 credits

This course will cover the Theoretical Foundations of Health Care Ethics. The student will learn how to apply the core principles of bioethics to the medical and health care decision-making process.

Course Competencies

Competency 3: The student will assess and report on central issues in clinical ethics, particularly problems that can arise regarding informed consent by:

- a. Utilizing and modeling self-reflection, listening, empathy, and awareness as an ethical leader.
- b. Recognizing ethical issues when they arise in the organization.
- c. Outlining the need for an 'Ethical Code' in clinical practice.
- d. Defining the terms 'Human Good' and 'Medical Good'.
