

Course Description

MUC1202 | Composition 2 | 2 credits

A two-semester sequential course introducing the basic elements and construction blocks of a musical composition and analysis. In addition, students will be expected to compose original short pieces as well as have them performed in a composition recital at the end of the semester.

- Orchestrating for various instruments or voice and learn the range, register, transposition, and sounds of each register, special techniques and possibilities within each instrument used in the

The student will develop melodic ideas culminating in a climax at the beginning, middle or end of a work by:

- Using appropriate musical notation in the work
- Economizing motivic and thematic ideas within a work
- Creating various types of melodic contour within a work
