

## **Course Description**

## PAS1812 | Behavioral & Community Medicine | 1.00 credit

This course utilizes a biopsychosocial system approach to identify social determinants within the health care delivery system. Students will participate in outreach projects to implement concepts learned in the classroom within a community environment. Prerequisites: PAS1800C, 1831, 2936

## **Course Competencies:**

**Competency 1:** The student will demonstrate an understanding of different psychosocial issues affecting disease by:

- 1. Understanding how social factors influence a patient's disease process
- 2. Identifying "at risk" populations
- 3. Recognizing signs of abuse and domestic violence

Competency 2: The student will analyze the concept of human sexuality within clinical medicine by:

- 1. Recognizing the impact of sexuality on patients of all ages
- Distinguishing determinants for patient behavior as it relates to sexuality and sexual behaviors

Competency 3: The student will integrate the concepts of death and dying within clinical practice by:

- 1. Distinguishing determinants for patient behavior as it relates to death and the grieving process
- 2. Role-playing patient case scenarios relating to delivering bad news
