#### (Part I)

<b>Course Title:</b>	Immigration Law Legal Specialty Seminar
<b>Course Number:</b>	PLA 2934
<b>Credits/Units</b>	1.0 hour
<b>Course Description:</b>	This course covers practical and theoretical training in U.S. Immigration Law. This course focuses on immigrants and laws that must be followed to visit the U.S. or to gain permanent resident status. This course provides a study and discussion of the forms used in the immigration process. Students will also gain an understanding of key terms used in immigration cases and how to assist attorneys in the preparation of immigration forms and how to work with immigration clients. (1 hour lecture)
<b>Course Objectives:</b>	Students who successfully complete this course will gain competence in: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Key immigration terms;</li><li>2. Key laws and regulations governing immigration and citizenship;</li><li>3. How to research immigration laws, regulations, cases and forms;</li><li>4. How to review and fill-out key immigration forms; and</li><li>5. How to avoid the unauthorized practice of law and other ethics violations as they relate to Immigration Law.</li></ol>
<b>Required Text &amp; Other Materials:</b>	No textbook is required because Immigration Law is a form-based area of law and this is also a condensed one credit course.
<b>Methods of Evaluation of Student Performance:</b>	In addition to participation in class, two written projects will be required in order to evaluate student performance.
<b>Practical Assignments that Develop Paralegal Competencies:</b>	In addition to examining and filling out key immigration forms, two written projects will be required in order to evaluate student performance.
