Course Competency

PRN 0006C Professional Role Transition

Course Description

This course facilitates the transition of the student to the role of PN. Emphasis is placed on issues related to nursing and healthcare, as well as skills necessary to provide care to multiple patients and assign tasks to other PN and unlicensed personnel. Concepts related to leadership and management are presented, as well as career development options that enhance career mobility. Standards of practice and the importance of practicing according to state regulations and statutes are examined. Clinical experiences provide the student the opportunity to apply theoretical concepts.
