

## **Course Description**

## RTV2300 | Broadcast Writing | 3.00 credits

In this intermediate workshop style class students will learn broadcast writing emphasizing news, documentary, commercials, and long-form programming.

## **Course Competencies**

Competency 1: The student will develop news gathering and writing skills by:

- 1. Analyzing different formats for news presentations on radio and television
- 2. Defining the mechanics of news gathering
- 3. Following industry standards in news writing

**Competency 2:** The student will develop commercial writing skills by:

- 1. Analyzing different formats for commercial and promotional scripts
- 2. Researching and developing product information to create an effective commercial or promotion
- 3. Applying product information in the writing of commercial or promotional scripts

**Competency 3:** The student will develop documentary writing skills by:

- 1. Discussing documentary form and function
- 2. Researching and developing documentary materials
- 3. Applying subject research in the writing of a documentary

Competency 4: The student will develop long-form broadcast writing skills by:

- 1. Analyzing the various styles of long-form shows
- 2. Researching the subject matter for a long form show
- 3. Developing situational content for a long form show
- 4. Analyzing the various formats for long-form scripts
- 5. Applying various formats for long programming through written assignments

- 1. Defining the function of the writer in the broadcast medium
- 2. Identifying ethical principles in broadcast writing
- 3. Following broadcast standards and timing
