

## **RUS 1121 ELEMENTARY RUSSIAN 2**

Course Description:

In this course, the student will be able to develop socially and culturally appropriate proficiency in interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational modes at the novice high level in Russian. Note: Students must pass this course with a C or better to continue to
