

SPW 2010 SELECTED READINGS IN SPANISH LITERATURE

Course Description

SPW 2010 explores Peninsular Spanish literature, focusing on Spanish culture, society, and humanistic expressions through various genres such as poetry, essay, novel, drama, and short story. Selected readings from different literary periods from the Middle Ages to the present will be studied. The course will be conducted in Spanish. Oral and written fluency in Spanish and/or permission from faculty or Department Chairperson.
