



Veteran exits homelessness, obtains degree with VA, partner help



<u>Wednesday, January 15, 2020 9:00 am</u><u>Veterans Homelessness</u><u>VAntage Point Contributor</u><u>383 views</u> After a 20-year career in the Army, Eddie Miller retired to focus on his family. Not long after, his wife died in an accident, setting into motion a series of events that saw Miller alone, homeless and hopeless. An encounter with <u>Operation Sacred</u> <u>Trust (OST)</u> helped bring him back. OST is a south Florida-based initiative funded by VA's <u>Supportive Services for Veteran</u> <u>Families (SSVF) Program</u> to end homelessness among Veterans.

After his wife's death, Miller tried to pursue a new life. It didn't work.

"My wife was my rock — we were married for 32 years," he said. "I gave up, stopped paying bills, and fell into a deep depression."

That's when Miller found OST. He was among the first welcomed into its new operation in 2012, when he attended an OST orientation along with 50 other homeless Veterans in the Miami area.

Preventing and ending Veteran homelessness

OST provides rapid rehousing, case management, and legal, financial, and emergency assistance to Veterans. It also helps them rebuild long lost connections with family and friends. Since 2011, the organization has helped prevent and end homelessness for nearly 3,000 Veterans and family members across south Florida.

Miller did so well, he began volunteering at OST, thanks to Seth Eisenberg, president and founder. "For Eddie and many others, they discovered the real support they'd always needed and wanted was closer than they imagined," Eisenberg said.

Ultimately, Miller's time with OST gave him the confidence he needed to get his life back together.

"I ended up going to school at Miami Dade College and obtained my associate degree in addiction studies," Miller said. "I made the dean's list and graduated with honors after not being in school for 40 years."

Now Miller resides in Memphis, Tennessee, close to one of his daughters and his grandchildren.

"I'm happy with where I'm at. I've got a beautiful place, and these are some of the best years of my life," Miller said.

In 2018, Miami-Dade County became among the largest urban communities in the nation to achieve benchmarks set by the Department of Housing and Urban Development to declare an end to chronic Veteran homelessness.

Once A Basketball Gym, New Tactical Training Center Will House The School Of Justice

North Campus is repurposing the abandoned basketball gvm in building 5 into the new Tactical Training Center, which will house the School of Justice after the project's completion in 2022.

The old basketball gym at North Campus, which has been dormant for more than 20 years, is getting a makeover.

It once hosted basketball games, gymnastics events and judo matches, but is now being transformed into a Tactical Training Center. Once construction is completed in 2022, it will house the School of Justice.

The two-story 79,954 square foot facility will serve as a training center for students in the SOI to get hands-on experience. It will include classrooms, a simulation firing range, an emergency operation center, holding cells, a rappelling tower, labs and a virtual reality decision making lab.

"The importance of repurposing the gym is to create a new facility for the School of Justice that will provide the training and educational programming needed for the future and current law enforcement officers of our community," said Fermin Vazquez, senior

director of campus administration at North Campus.

The School of Justice, located in building 8, will be used for additional classroom space.

Planning for the space began in 2014, when MDC received \$9 million in state funding. The project remained in limbo until last year when the College provided the remaining amount from their annual fiscal budget to construct the facility. The total budget for the project is \$35,238,932.


Before it was a gym, the space served as an airplane hanger during World War II, eventually becoming a naval air station for the Miami-Opa Locka Executive Airport.

After the College bought the property in the '60s, it was transformed into a basketball gym for the athletics department to use for MDC and highschool games, until athletics was moved to Kendall Campus in the mid-'90s.

Since then, the space has been abandoned. MDC hired Stobs Brothers Construction and Leo A Daly Architects to revitalize the facility.

In addition, the emergency operation center to be built within the facility will also house the College's first-ever emergency operations center.

"In order to teach students


about the field, they needed to be exposed to the real world setting of a dispatch center and be exposed to the technology that comes with it," Vazquez said. "If we already built it for educational purposes, why not build it for the


College's purpose?"

Although input will mostly come from administration and faculty, professors at the SOJ will also request input from students to access what the building needs.

"It will provide a state-of-the-art

training center to our students and industry partners where they can learn theory and practice in real world settings," said Raimundo Socorro, dean of the School of Justice, Public Safety, Law Studies at North Campus.

The gallery is free and open to the public.



Join MOAD at MDC for the opening reception of Forensic Architecture: True to Scale, with a special discussion by Forensic Architecture founding director Eyal Weizman.

Comprised of architects, software developers, filmmakers, journalists, lawyers, artists, and scientists, Forensic Architecture is a research agency that uses architectural software and an architectural sensibility to investigate human rights violations.

Forensic Architecture: True to Scale displays the evidence and explains the methodologies behind over a dozen Forensic Architecture investigations. While providing an overview of how advanced techniques such as photogrammetry, audio analysis, augmented reality, 3D modeling, machine learning, and crowd sourcing support their findings, the exhibition considers the complex relationship between a material fact and its representation in the public realm. Amidst what Founding Director Eyal Weizman refers to as the "dark epistemology" of a post-truth media environment, this collection of meticulously researched, carefully analyzed, and conscientiously presented evidence demonstrates that it is both possible and imperative to verify what is really happening in the world around us.

Forensic Architecture: True to Scale is curated by Sophie Landres. It is made possible by the support of the John S. and James L. 'Terrestrial Bodies' takes on mighty task in a deceptively modest way

"Terrestrial Bodies," a challenging installation by widely exhibited Afro-Cuban artist Juana Valdes, raises more questions than it answers.

It occupies the Miami Dade College Cuban Legacy Gallery at MDC Special Collections on the first floor of the Freedom Tower, and is organized by Wanda Texon, senior curator of the MDC Museum of Art and Design, which is also in the Freedom Tower.

Valdes has scavenged remains of what could be called the capitalism of "collectibles" to map centuries of trade between the northern and southern reaches of the globe. Her effort peels back a unique perspective on world geography and history. That perspective is rooted in the artist's own experience and genetic research into her mother's ancestors, who were primarily Sub-Saharan and East Asian.

As Valdes explains in a statement, she is charting "the complex terrain of multiple cultures and nations" comprising her own identity, and "how it is constantly shaped and reshaped by experiences of displacement and transculturation."

The genius of "Terrestrial Bodies" is that it takes on this mighty task in a deceptively modest way. It dares to meld the tacky, sweet clutter of a yard sale with the contemplative spirit of conceptual art.

Entering the Cuban Legacy Gallery, you'll notice that posted on its walls are history museum-inspired labels that say, "Congolese," "Broadly European" and "Indonesian," to mark this as a place of cultural crossroads, a nexus between north and south.

There's a shelf about 5 feet high running along three walls of the gallery. In keeping with the artist's map-making sensibility, the shelf marks a precisely drawn line around the gallery similar to the Trop-

ic of Capricorn demarcating a region in the Southern Hemisphere.

Stepping closer, you are directly confronted with the mock yard sale aura suffusing the exhibit. Arranged along this shelf is a curious assortment of more than 100 objects and souvenirs. They include massproduced plates, mugs, goblets in glass and metal, as well as hand-carved wooden figures and animals. Individually, many objects seem fairly unremarkable, but arrayed in this distinctive context, they impishly and defiantly command our attention.

Why are they here? What do they mean? Whose souvenirs are they? Whose memories do they reflect? For viewers, such questions may flicker with the annoying insistence of a strobe light, while the eye travels on to yet more compelling and maddening juxtapositions of objects.

The objects are carefully, even gracefully spaced, positioned one after the other. In this placement is an aesthetic attention to scale, to the rhythm of contrasting shapes following next to repeating forms. This delicate procession of hand-held, ordinary objects on a shelf creates an unfolding visual composition, parallel to notes written across a musical composition, or images in a threedimensional artist's book.

A carved wooden stork gracefully points his beak upward. A white sugar bowl with gilded handles is next to a mismatched creamer with tarnishing silver trim. A wooden stool with an elephant carved in its base supports dark, wooden boxes inlaid with tiny, intricate geometric patterns of variously colored wood and possibly ivory.

There's the preening white china figurine of a woman with a lavish Marie Antoinette-styled pompadour and gown. Not far away are two carved wooden heads with Afro-Caribbean features, one stacked on top of a cigar box labeled "La Perla Habana."

What's curious about these objects is that while

some are similar, none of the dishes, goblets or cups match. Each is a kind of orphan in this gathering of market-savvy souvenirs, which might or might not accurately represent the country from which they seem to originate.

Many are made from mass-produced porcelain, a material that's fascinated Valdes since she took part in residencies in The European Ceramic Workcentre in The Netherlands in 2002 and 2013. As an indication of her long interest in the metaphoric resonance of simple, handheld objects, she first produced a series of delicate porcelain objects resembling children's paper boats. She then became intrigued with the role of Dutch ceramics in the history of global trade, beginning with the Dutch East India Co. in the 17th century.

Thus began her historic research into connections between routes of global trade and migration, finding links to colonialism and exploitative labor practices.

What has resulted from this research is not a scholarly text but poetic, stimulating art. An accomplished printmaker, Valdes enhances this exhibit by punctuating the display of objects with her exquisite series of cyanotype prints. They are radiant with an oceanic deep blue, evoking centuries of risky overseas travel.

Some depict a cartographer's gridded charts, while others depict floating undersides of white pieces of china. As stand-ins for terrestrial bodies, these fragments of trade carry faint marks of their origins, too easily washed away and forgotten.






Pérez Art Museum Miami (PAMM)
