Kendall Campus Schools of Crafts Scholarship

This merit-based scholarship will provide recipients an opportunity to attend a two-week long workshop at either the Penland School of Crafts in North Carolina or the Haystack Mountain School of Crafts in Maine. The scholarship is for registration fees, housing, transportation, meals, and supplies. The number of awarded recipients will be based on availability of funds.

Penland is an international center for craft education dedicated to helping people live creative lives. Located in the Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina, Penland offers workshops in books & paper, clay, painting, drawing, glass, iron, metals, photography, printmaking and letterpress, textiles, and wood. The school also offers artists' residencies. Students can select any available Penland two-week summer workshop that is currently open. Haystack Mountain School of Crafts is an international craft school located on the Atlantic Ocean in Deer Isle, Maine. The school offers intensive studio-based workshops in a variety of craft media including clay, glass, metals, paper, blacksmithing, weaving, woodworking and more. Programs range from short workshops to twoweek sessions and anyone may participate, from beginners to advanced professionals. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- 1.) Students **must** submit a scholarship application form.
- 2.) Students must submit 3 to 5 artwork images to be reviewed by the scholarship selection committee.
- 3.) Students **must** submit an essay on how either school of art workshops will help the student develop as an artist. The essay must be a minimum 500 words no more than 1,500 words.

SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

- 1.) Student(s) must have a minimum of a 3.50 GPA.
- 2.) Student(s) must be either concurrently enrolled or have successfully completed Drawing 1 and Color and Composition with a B or higher grade in each at the time of applying for this scholarship.
- 3.) Student(s) must be working towards an arts degree/major at Miami Dade College Kendall Campus.
- 4.) Student(s) must have demonstrated financial need based on federal financial aid standards, as determined by the College's Financial Aid Office, or demonstrated economic hardship.
- 5.) This is a one-time award and shall cover fees and charges within the following expense categories: tuition/fees/registration, transportation, housing, meals, and supplies.
- 6.) If awarded, recipients must submit a copy of their sketchbook for use in promotional materials at the conclusion of the workshop.
- 7.) Recipients are required to submit and upload to a specified mdc drop box a video journal highlighting their experience at Penland or Haystack. This video journal will be shared with prospective scholarship candidates.

The application and materials must be received no later than October 28th, 2016.
