They help guide the reader from one idea to the next and help give your writing coherence and make it appear organized. They assist in the logical flow of ideas as they signal the relationship between sentences and paragraphs.*

TO ADD	and, also, besides, further, furthermore, too, moreover, in addition, then, of equal importance, another
TO COMPARE	like, in the same manner, similarly, also, likewise
TO CONTRAST	although, even though, however, in contrast, nevertheless, but, on the contrary, on the other hand, whereas, yet, still, nonetheless
TO CONCEDE (a point)	certainly, granted that, of course, no doubt, to be sure
TO EMPHASIZE	above all, especially, in fact, in particular, indeed, surely, most important
TO ILLUSTRATE	for example, to illustrate, for instance, to be specific, such as
TO PLACE (location)	above, beside, below, beyond, further, here, inside, nearby, next to, on the far side, outside, in front of, behind
TO PLACE (in time)	First, second ..., finally, next, then, to begin with, last of all, after, before, as soon as, now, later
TO SHOW RESULT	so, because, as a consequence, consequently, as a result, hence, therefore, thus, for this reason, because of this
TO SUMMARIZE	all in all, in brief, in other words, last, on the whole, to sum up, in conclusion, as you can see
