Following are some ideas for how the library can work for you during your academic career.



Research

How can students learn about the library and writing research papers?

- Visit our Reference Desk and ask our librarians to help you to get started.
- Come with your class for a library session scheduled by your instructor.
- Refer to the Kendall Campus Library's Guides page, which contains links to tutorials, helpful web pages, handouts, and subject-specific pathfinders.



- Use the service known as *Ask a Librarian* from your home computer.



- The library provides “24 / 7” access to over 80 periodical research databases online.



- Through the library web page, you can access hundreds of electronic or 'E-Books'.





Library Instruction

The purpose of Library Instruction is to familiarize students with the library. **Hands-on- instruction sessions** are conducted by reference librarians in the Electronic Classroom (room 2253) by appointment.



If your schedule permits, you can sign up for a one- credit class, LIS 1001, Introduction to Library Research. The class meets Wednesdays from 11:00 a.m-11:50 a.m. Call (305) 237-2295 for information.

What are Reserve Materials ?



Faculty members may arrange to have certain materials placed on reserve for their students. These materials are kept at the Circulation/Reserve Desk, and circulate according to the instructor's specifications. Some items may not be taken from the library while others may be borrowed for a limited amount of time.



Students may use the library copy machines for unlimited copying. Each copy is 15 cents.



Textbooks

Are Textbooks for classes available in the library?

The Library normally does not purchase class textbooks. If your professor wishes, he or she may place extra copies of your textbook on Reserve for students to use in the library. Check with the Circulation/ Reserve Desk on the first floor to see if your textbooks are on Reserve.
