## Hate Crimes Investigation “Considering Law Enforcement’s Response”

(8 Hours)

**Description:** This course is intended to provide law enforcement officers with a comprehensive analysis of hate motivated crimes, their history in America and specifically in Florida, and their unique impact upon victims and population groups which identify with those victims. Special attention will be paid to the role of police officers in investigating hate crimes, and with preventative measures which may be taken by law enforcement agencies. The course will include identifying extremist groups and the role of the internet in stimulating hate crimes. Florida and Federal hate crimes laws will be reviews. Course participants will be encouraged to discuss a number of provocative issues related to hate crimes laws including: What is the need for separate laws for hate motivated crimes? Do hate crimes laws punish free speech and diminish First Amendment freedom? What type of evidence is needed to prove a crime was hate motivated?

**Course Objectives:**

- \* An understanding of the history of hate motivated crimes and how they differ from similar crimes that do not contain the hate element.
- \* Providing law enforcement officers with an understanding of the special impact hate motivated crimes have upon minority victims and their communities. Specific attention will be given to foreign born victims and the implications of their relationships to home-country police agencies.
- \*Identifying the activities of organized extremist groups and the role fo the internet in stimulating hate crimes.

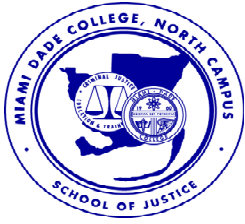
