

All MDC **Associate in Arts** and **Bachelor’s degree-seeking** students are required by the State of Florida to meet the College-Level Academic Skills (CLAS) requirements for graduation.

The CLAST exam is no longer offered effective July 1, 2009; however, if you took the CLAST exam by June 30, 2009 and received passing scores in all subtests (English, Reading, Essay and Math), you have met the CLAS requirements.

If you have not taken the CLAST exam, you may meet the CLAS requirements by testing (option 1) or by grade point average—GPA (option 2), as listed below.

* The minimum scores listed above are effective 4/1/1995. For prior minimum scores, visit the [CLAS web site](#).

** Any course abbreviation/number version in the Statewide Course Numbering System of a CLAS-eligible course may be used to meet CLAS requirements. For example, ENC2135 is equivalent to ENC2300, and therefore it is CLAS-eligible.

¹ You can meet the CLAS requirement by GPA (option 2) in CLAS-eligible courses earned by CLEP, AP, or IB with a grade of “S”. A course grade of “S” combined with another course grade of “S”, “A” or “B” is acceptable.

² Labs, non-college-level courses, including courses that are considered college prep, and courses with a “9” in the second-digit position (using statewide course numbering system, such as ENC1990), are NOT CLAS-eligible courses.
