Who Owns The Story? (THE FOURTH OF A FOUR - PANEL SERIES)

Lecture by Carolyn Dorfman, whose work focuses on Jewish history and stories, will explore the role of storytelling in preserving and sharing history.

South Florida is home to a large Jewish community, which includes Holocaust survivors. As they pass on, the community is examining the importance of preserving their stories.

Questions posed include: Is there a public responsibility to share cultural stories? How does manner of story sharing change or affect the future? These questions are also relevant for Miami's Cuban exile community, which like the Jewish diaspora, has experienced issues provoked by its own unique stories of struggle and survival.
