

Course Description

BUL2242 | Business Law 2 | 3.00 credits

Emphasis on the laws affecting agencies, the formation and operation of partnership and corporation, personal and real property, insurance, surety ship, estates and bankruptcy, and a general review of government regulations affecting usual business operations. Prerequisite: BUL2241.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate an understanding of agency by:

- 1. Describing the basic concepts of agency
- 2. Describing the third person in the agency
- 3. Explaining regulation of employment
- 4. Discussing the equal employment opportunity law

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate an understanding of business organizations by:

- 1. describing the different types of business organizations
- 2. defining partnerships
- 3. defining limited liability partnerships and companies
- 4. explaining corporation formation
- 5. describing shareholder rights in corporations
- 6. explaining securities regulation
- 7. describing accountants' liability and malpractice
- 8. explaining the management of corporations

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate an understanding of real property and estates by:

- 1. Defining real property
- 2. Discussing environmental law and land use controls
- 3. Defining leases
- 4. Explaining descendants' estates and trusts
