

## Course Description

## CJC1162 | Parole Probation | 3.00 credits

The history, current practices and the consideration of philosophical concepts in the areas of probation and parole.

## Course Competencies:

**Competency 1:** The student will discuss the history of probation and parole by:

- 1. Tracing the historical development of probation and parole
- 2. Comparing and contrasting the goals of parole and probation within a historical context
- 3. Discussing future trends in probation and parole based upon past systems

**Competency 2:** The student will examine the impact of punishment philosophy on probation and parole on community-based programs by:

- 1. Examining trends in legislation
- 2. Reviewing Truth in Sentencing laws Examining the Contract with America Crime Bill

**Competency 3:** The student will see the impact of recent legislation on issues in probation, parole, and community corrections.

- 1. Analyzing patterns of prison overcrowding
- 2. Evaluating rates of incarceration and construction costs
- 3. Analyzing patterns of staffing in the community corrections setting

**Competency 4:** Analyze the effectiveness of parole and probation on public safety by:

- 1. Reviewing the literature assessing parole, probation, and community corrections
- 2. Examining and studying patterns of recidivism
- 3. Analyzing research reports from the Department of Justice on parole, probation, and community corrections

**Competency 5:** The student will Analyze the role of the parole board by:

- 1. Tracing the historical emergence of parole boards
- 2. Analyzing the shifts in political power and its impact on parole boards
- 3. Examining the patterns of parole board selection

**Competency 6:** The student will view parole, probation, and community corrections programs for juvenile offenders by:

- 1. Analyzing the philosophy of juvenile justice
- 2. Comparing and contrasting the notion and nature of treatment compared to control
- 3. Contrasting foster care to group homes
- 4. Reviewing findings on the impact of "deinstitutionalization" on juvenile recidivism

**Competency 7:** The student will Analyze the requisites of probation and parole officers by:

- 1. Defining the duties and responsibilities of the parole officer
- 2. Examining the ethical considerations of parole/probation officers
- 3. Researching the salaries and educational requirements for officers
- 4. Evaluating the nature of the occupational hazards and considerations

**Competency 8:** The student will Analyze the concept of community justice by:

- 1. Identifying patterns of recidivism by
  - a. community justice type
- 2. Distinguishing between successful and unsuccessful community justice initiatives

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- 3. Discussing the role of citizens in effective community corrections
- 4. Describing the essential elements of community justice

**Competency 9:** The student will discuss the role of law enforcement in parole, probation, and community corrections by:

- 1. Defining police responsibilities in relationship to probation and parole
- 2. Identifying the relationship between the community and law enforcement in community corrections
- 3. Assessing the type of parole/probation violations and the role of law enforcement
