

Course Description

CJK0021 | Serving Your Community | 1.13 credits

The student will learn a community's relationship with law enforcement can greatly impact how law enforcement officers do their jobs. Students will also learn how to respond to people in crisis and high risk.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will learn to interacting with the community by:

- 1. Identifying and responding to and interacting with your community, including vulnerable adults
- 2. Identifying and responding to the unique needs of people who are elderly in your community
- 3. Identifying and responding to the unique needs of juveniles in your community, including juvenile offenders
- 4. Identifying and responding to the unique needs of military veterans in your community
- 5. Discussing how to respectfully interact with and provide support to people who are homeless in your community
- 6. Interacting with and protecting the rights of people who have a disability, as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- 7. Interacting with and protecting the rights of people with physical impairments as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- 8. Interacting with and protecting the rights and dignity of people with developmental disabilities, including intellectual disabilities
- 9. Interacting with people with an autism spectrum disorder and how to ensure their safety while in custody
- 10. Discussing basic knowledge of common mental illnesses and how to respond to incidents involving people who potentially have a mental illness

Competency 2: The student will learn how to respond to a person in crisis by:

- 1. Recognizing and responding to a person in crisis while remaining respectful and impartial
- 2. Identifying the criteria and action to take when interacting with a person who qualifies for services under the Baker Act
- 3. Discussing how to safely intervene in a potential suicide situation
- 4. Recognizing illnesses that mimic substance abuse and the stages of substance abuse and treatment
- 5. Identifying the criteria and action to take when interacting with a person who qualifies for services under the Marchman Act
- 6. Discussing how to transport a person in crisis as well as documenting the incident on the proper forms

Competency 3: The student will learn how to identify and respond to high-risk groups by:

- 1. Defining criminal gang
- 2. Recognizing indicators of gang activity and the importance of documenting observable identifiers
- 3. Identifying characteristics of extremist groups, their members, and associates

Learning Outcomes:

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Formulate strategies to locate, evaluate, and apply information
- Demonstrate knowledge of ethical thinking and its application to issues in society
