

Course Description

DEH1800 | Dental Hygiene 1 | 2.00 credits

This course is concerned with the principles of skills required in the removal of hard and soft deposits from the teeth, including use of a dental hand-piece, prophylaxis paste, ultrasonic scaling, and air polishing; preparing the patient's care plan; providing preventive and educational procedures such as sealants, and calculus charting; applying the principles of Angle's Classification of Occlusion; caring for orthodontic appliances and prostheses; management of the pediatric patient; valuing the need for sharp instruments; applying the principles of desensitization with appropriate clinical agents; applying the principles of dental charting; utilizing the principles of a comprehensive intra- and extra-oral examination; and researching a dental topic and writing an APA-style paper for eventual creation of an informative poster.

- 3. Describing anterior crossbite
