

Course Description

DEH2702L | Community Dental Health II | 2.00 credits

This course is designed to provide an opportunity for the dental hygiene student to deliver health education in a community setting. This experience will allow the student to promote oral health in an environment other than private practice to a population with special needs. In addition, it will provide the opportunity to interact with other medical and dental health professionals.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will be able to demonstrate comprehension and application of planning a community dental health education program by:

- 1. Assessing the target population
- 2. Identifying population demographics
- 3. Conducting an oral health survey to determine oral health needs
- 4. Surveying the population to determine dental health knowledge, attitudes, values, and behaviors

Competency 2: The student will be able to demonstrate comprehension and application of planning a dental health education program to meet dental needs based on the results of the assessment by:

- 1. Identifying available resources
- 2. Discussing the survey results with appropriate staff and personnel
- 3. Formulating program goals and objectives
- 4. Identifying constraints or barriers affecting goal attainment
- 5. Identifying sources and/or services which would support program success
- 6. Outlining activities to meet program objectives

Competency 3: The student will be able to demonstrate comprehension and application of implementing the dental health education program to meet the oral health needs of the population by:

- 1. Monitoring the program on a continuous basis to identify the need for revisions.
- 2. Continuing to seek and develop avenues to support program activities
- 3. Continuing to enlist the support of other health professionals

Competency 4: The student will be able to demonstrate comprehension and application of evaluating the dental health education program to determine if population needs were met by:

- 1. Assessing the population using the same instruments used in the assessment
- 2. Identifying whether program goals and objectives were met
- 3. Providing suggestions for other members of the setting so they can continue to incorporate dental health education activities in the future
- 4. Reflecting on the personal growth, client satisfaction and oral health improvements made because of the program
