

# **Course Description**

# DSC4012 | Terrorism | 3.00 credits

A study of domestic and international terrorism, using current events and past incidents for analysis, to include the events, the responses, and the outcomes. Prerequisite: CCJ1020

#### **Course Competencies**

**Competency 1:** The student will analyze the evolving forms of terrorism by:

- 1. Defining and discussing the context of terrorism
- 2. Exploring the typologies of terrorism
- 3. Identifying and discussing the tactics of terrorism

**Competency 2:** The student will analyze individual and group terrorist behavior by:

- 1. Exploring group behavior
- 2. Researching and reviewing terrorist profiles
- 3. Discussing individualistic terrorists

**Competency 3:** The student will analyze group structures by:

- 1. Exploring the structure of terrorist groups
- 2. Defining and discussing "lone wolf" terrorists
- 3. Defining and exploring "berserker" terrorists

**Competency 4:** The student will analyze the relationship between religion and terrorism by:

- 1. Exploring Hoffman's analysis of religious terrorism
- 2. Discussing Huntington's "A Clash of Civilization"

**Competency 5:** The student will analyze the origins and history of terrorism by:

- 1. Discussing the French revolution
- 2. Describing the Russian revolution
- 3. Defining anarchy
- 4. Discussing a class revolution

**Competency 6:** The student will demonstrate knowledge of regional terrorism by:

- 1. Discussing the history of the regions where terrorism exists
- 2. Describing the religions in areas where terrorism exists

**Competency 7:** The student will demonstrate knowledge of middle eastern terrorism by:

- 1. Discussing the demographics of the region
- 2. Identifying and describing the geography of the region
- 3. Discussing ethnic group rivalries in the area

**Competency 8:** The student will analyze domestic terrorism by:

- 1. Identifying and describing traits of right-wing extremism
- 2. Identifying and describing traits of left-wing extremism
- 3. Describing animal rights extremism
- 4. Discussing eco-extremism

**Competency 9:** The student will demonstrate knowledge of terrorist weapons by:

- 1. Discussing weapons of mass destruction
- 2. Describing nuclear, biological, and chemical weapons
- 3. Analyzing cyber-terrorism

# **Competency 10:** The student will demonstrate knowledge of counterterrorism techniques by:

- 1. Discussing intelligence gathering
- 2. Analyzing security precautions
