

Course Description

EAP1686 | Advanced 2 - Integrated Reading, Speech & Listening | 6.00 credits

Students will learn to comprehend academic and other authentic reading materials and effectively participate in college-level oral/aural tasks by applying appropriate learning strategies. Prerequisites: EAP1586 or 1520, and 1500. Co-requisite: one (1) approved college level course.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate comprehension of college level academic and other authentic reading materials in English for academic purposes by:

- 1. Using authentic academic reading assignments with general education content
- 2. Predicting content by applying background knowledge
- 3. Identifying the topic and purpose of reading selections
- 4. Recognizing stated and implied main ideas
- 5. Distinguishing generalizations and theories
- 6. Recognizing rhetorical patterns and shifts in patterns
- 7. Examining the meaning of relationships within and among sentences
- 8. Identifying overall organizational patterns
- 9. Recognizing cultural references and idiomatic expressions
- 10. Enhancing general and academic vocabulary
- 11. Relating text themes to personal experience

Competency 2: The student will display critical thinking skills by:

- 1. Asking meaningful questions
- 2. Distinguishing facts from opinions
- 3. Extrapolating and manipulating facts
- 4. Analyzing and synthesizing information
- 5. Making inferences, conclusions, and interpretations
- 6. Identifying assumptions and inferring hypotheses
- 7. Identifying diverse perspectives with respect to beliefs, arguments, and theories
- 8. Interpreting an author's point of view and tone
- 9. Evaluating the credibility and argumentation of a text
- 10. Interpreting aesthetic properties of language

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate linguistic flexibility and proficiency in reading, listening, and speech by:

- 1. Adjusting reading and listening strategies including interpreting visual data
- 2. Increasing overall reading rate and fluency
- 3. Differentiating between registers
- 4. Justifying an opinion
- 5. Planning delivery with attention to audience and peer interaction needs

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate the ability to produce college level academic oral/aural tasks by:

- 1. Participating in college level oral communication tasks, real and simulated situations
- 2. Following complex instructions
- 3. Preparing for participation by researching support materials
- 4. Paraphrasing and summarizing information from original sources and crediting those sources

- 5. Speaking at an advanced level with comprehensible pronunciation, stress, and intonation
- 6. Comprehending lectures and participating in class discussions and activities
- 7. Identifying a speaker's overall purpose, main ideas, point of view, and tone
- 8. Predicting content
- 9. Identifying and using listening and note taking strategies
- 10. Analyzing and summarizing extensive discourse
- 11. Critiquing presentations
- 12. Incorporating cultural references and idiomatic expressions
- 13. Expanding and incorporating academic and general vocabulary

Competency 5: The student will apply learning strategies by:

- 1. Using the Learning Management System (LMS) to complete online assignments and activities
- 2. Applying test taking strategies and skills
- 3. Using self-monitoring and critical reflection to improve speaking skills
- 4. Outlining and annotating academic reading materials
