

Course Description

EDG3410 | Classroom Management and Communication for P-12 Teachers | 3.00 credits

In this teacher certification course, the student will learn to develop practical strategies and use applicable skills to create a positive, safe, organized, equitable, flexible, inclusive, collaborative, and student-centered P-12 classroom environment that promotes learning.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate a general knowledge of behavior management systems, classroom management, and appropriate behavioral interventions pertaining to P-12 classrooms (FEAP 2) by:

- 1. Defining classroom management
- 2. Identifying the fundamental principles associated with recognized theorists (Dreikurs Ginott, Canter, Kounin, Jones, Glasser, Gordon, Kohn, Albert, Colorso, Nelson, Lott, Bandura, Kohlberg, Gilligan, Bailey, and Fay and Funk)
- 3. Comparing selected group management models that focus on positive behaviors
- 4. Analyzing behavior management systems for the classroom
- 5. Examining the teacher's role as the classroom manager
- 6. Outlining students' behavioral accountability requirements
- 7. Correlating school behavioral management policies and procedures to classroom management plans

Competency 2: The student will design an effective P-12 classroom management plan (FEAP 2) by:

- 1. Identifying communication techniques appropriate for use with students
- 2. Researching constructive teacher-student interactions
- 3. Organizing the physical environment to facilitate student learning and promote safety
- 4. Developing classroom routines with students
- 5. Establishing and conveying high expectations for/to all students
- 6. Formulating procedures and strategies to smoothly transition students between activities

Competency 3: The student will describe appropriate P-12 classroom management techniques (FEAP 2) by:

- 1. Discussing self-discipline and self-regulation as the ultimate goal for the individual student
- 2. Differentiating between elements of effective and ineffective behavior management systems for the classroom with diverse learners
- 3. Developing a plan for student progression from teacher-directed to self-regulated
- 4. Applying data collection strategies to assess student behavior
- 5. Adapting the strategies to accommodate for the differing needs and diversity of students

Competency 4: The student will develop collaboration and consultation skills (FEAP 2, 6) by:

- 1. Explaining effective methods of consultation and collaboration with families and students of diverse backgrounds
- 2. Describing effective methods of consultation and collaboration with administrators, classroom teachers, and other educational professionals
- 3. Synthesizing information provided by families, outside agencies, and other professionals
- 4. Describing effective communication strategies to use with families, administrators, classroom teachers, other educational professionals, and outside agencies
- 5. Interpreting the essential elements of a behavioral assessment and an intervention plan
- 6. Analyzing data from a student's behavioral assessment and an intervention plan

Competency 5: The student will analyze research, trends, as well as legal and ethical standards related to effective P-12 classroom management (FEAP 2, 6) by:

1. Examining current research and trends influencing educational practices

- 2. Analyzing the implications of professional standards and ethical decision-making in the classroom
- 3. Exploring current policies and laws that influence behavior management techniques
- 4. Examining the teacher's legal responsibilities, and procedures for reporting suspected student emotional distress abuse, substance abuse, neglect, and suicidal tendencies
