

## **Course Description**

## EEC4936 | Student Teaching Seminar I: ECE | 1.00 credit

The student will learn to discuss and reflect on their development and mastery of the Pre-Professional Florida Educator Accomplished Practices during the completion of their internship in a Birth-Four classroom setting. Corequisites: EEC4940.

## **Course Competencies**

**Competency 1:** The student will recognize the role of the teacher by:

- 1. Preparing a Professional Development Plan with the assistance of cooperating and supervising teachers and reflect on meeting its goals
- 2. Reflecting on B-4 student learning experiences and outcomes to plan for instruction
- 3. Identifying instruction that uses a variety of culturally and linguistically relevant materials and resources in B-4 settings
- 4. Participating in a variety of professional activities appropriate to the area of specialization

**Competency 2:** The student will prepare for professional employment by:

- 1. Participating in sessions on interviewing at an early childhood center
- 2. Participating in sessions on applying for jobs with Miami-Dade County Public Schools, Head Start, and private early childhood centers
- 3. Participating in a session on the purpose and creation of the Instructional Performance Evaluation and Growth System and evaluation systems used in other early childhood centers
- 4. Preparing a Professional Development Plan with the assistance of cooperating and supervising teachers and reflecting on meeting its goals
- 5. Identifying graduate school opportunities that are available in the local community
- 6. Recognizing the importance of educational neuroscience and the young child's developing brain
- 7. Identifying how to perform First Aid and CPR in the classroom setting
- 8. Participating in professional development sessions on relevant topics to impact teaching practice

**Competency 3:** The student will communicate and work cooperatively with families and colleagues to support educational experiences of students in the B-4 setting by:

- Collecting information regarding children's funds of knowledge through conversations with children's families
- 2. Explaining how family members can share educational goals and family activities that support those goals
- 3. Creating opportunities for family members to become engaged in and contribute to school-based activities
- 4. Discussing ways to involve family members in evaluating children's learning at school

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Demonstrate knowledge of ethical thinking and its application to issues in society
