EEX4930 | Seminar in Exceptional Student Education | 3.00 credits

The teacher candidate will engage in professional dialogue and explore professional learning opportunities related to teaching students with exceptionalities. This seminar course is taken in conjunction with a full time, supervised teaching experience and provides an opportunity to examine and reflect on the daily experiences of becoming a highly effective teacher.

Course Competencies
