

Course Description

FIL1030 | History of Film | 3.00 credits

In this introductory course students will learn about the history of motion pictures, with an emphasis on American and European films.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will identify and discuss major films in the history of the medium by:

- 1. Developing a vocabulary of basic film terminology
- 2. Identifying film techniques and styles
- 3. Extrapolating the attributes of selected motion pictures

Competency 2: The student will identify key attributes of American and European film movements by:

- 1. Defining thematic, visual, and aural traits
- 2. Examining economic, social, and political factors that shaped each film
- 3. Describing traits and factors of selected motion pictures for the various film movements.

Competency 3: The student will understand films within their historical and cultural contexts by:

- 1. Examining technological advances of motion pictures throughout history
- 2. Comparing and contrasting various films from different countries and different eras
- 3. Comparing and contrasting the historical and cultural attributes of film through written assignments
