

## **Course Description**

## FIL1055 | American Independent film | 3.00 credits

In this introductory course, students will learn about the American independent film movement with an emphasis on American directors and producers.

## **Course Competencies:**

**Competency 1:** The student will identify and discuss major independent films in the history of the medium by:

- 1. Developing a vocabulary of basic independent film terminology
- 2. Identifying independent film techniques and styles
- 3. Identifying the attributes of selected films

Competency 2: The student will understand independent films within their historical and cultural contexts by:

- 1. Defining thematic, visual, and aural traits
- 2. Examining economic, social, and political factors that shaped each film
- 3. Explaining the historical and cultural attributes of American independent films through written assignments

**Competency 3:** The student will develop a personal career strategy by:

- 1. Identifying the career choices made by various independent film directors and producers
- 2. Examining how the career choices made by various independent film directors and producers and how these choices led to their success
