

Course Description

FIL1420C | Film Production 1: Introduction to the Filmmaking Process | 4.00 credits

An introductory overview of the art and technology of narrative motion picture production. Students will learn basic production techniques, from pre-production through production to final screening. Corequisite: FIL2552C.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate proficiency in basic image capturing by:

- 1. Identifying the components of a camera
- 2. Applying the settings for the operation of a camera
- 3. Identifying the components of a light meter
- 4. Performing accurate light meter readings

- 1. Defining crew positions and individual responsibilities for motion picture production
- 2. Integrating crew positions to produce a short film

Competency 3: The student will incorporate various film components into production by:

- 1. Composing dynamic visual images
- 2. Using a variety of shots
- 3. Creating film sequences

Competency 4: The student will develop and demonstrate an understanding of the language of cinema by:

- 1. Utilizing the components of compelling visual storytelling
- 2. Screening and critiquing short films
