

Course Description

HSC4942 | Community Service Learning Practicum | 3.00 credits

This course is designed to engage students in meaningful healthcare related community service learning activities. Students will learn to explore new collaborations in service-learning, cultural diversity and community healthcare development. These experiences will help to and prepare them for lives as civically-engaged local, national, and global citizens. Pre-Req: PAS3019, 3042C, 3070, 3140, 3203C

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will develop a service learning project for a specific healthcare community by:

- 1. Performing 30 service learning hours in a health underserved community
- 2. Performing a community health assessment
- 3. Assessing community resources for patients and their families
- 4. Writing a plan of action for the patients and their families

Competency 2: The student will utilize communication skills with various stakeholders in the community by:

- 1. Forming positive human relationships consistent with patient/practitioner interactions
- 2. Creating effective service learning programming that is constructive and tailored to meet the needs and interests of clients
- 3. Forming active relationships with all stakeholders in the program, including families, schools, parents, community volunteers, government officials, and other healthcare professionals

Competency 3: The student will engage in Community Healthcare Service Learning to participate in healthcare-related community service, emphasizing the importance of collaboration and cultural understanding by:

- 1. Participating in meaningful healthcare-related community service learning activities to gain hands-on experience and develop practical skills in various healthcare settings
- 2. Exploring new collaborations in service-learning initiatives that address cultural diversity and community healthcare development, enhancing understanding of diverse community needs
- 3. Reflecting on experiences in community service to evaluate personal growth and the impact of service on local, national, and global healthcare issues, fostering a commitment to civic engagement

- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Formulate strategies to locate, evaluate, and apply information
- Create strategies that can be used to fulfill personal, civic, and social responsibilities
