

Course Description

ISS2270 | Multicultural Communication and Relations | 3.00 credits

This interdisciplinary course includes works from the Western canon and examines fundamental social and behavioral science concepts related to human communication and interactions. Students will analyze how various demographic factors influence personal development and societal structures, using established scientific principles to explore past and present social, political, and economic issues. The course emphasizes critical thinking and the application of social science concepts to understand human behavior and interactions within the context of evolving societies.

Course Competencies:

- 3. Evaluating the effectiveness of communication strategies in culturally heterogeneous contexts.
- 4. Applying theoretical frameworks to understand the complexities of communication between culturally heterogeneous individuals.

Competency 3: The student will explain the role of cultural patterns, verbal codes, and non-verbal codes in the development of interpersonal relationships by:

- 1. Identifying and describing the cultural patterns that influence the development of interpersonal relationships.
- 2. Analyzing the impact of verbal codes on the development of interpersonal relationships.
- 3. Analyzing the impact of non-verbal codes on the development of interpersonal relationships.
- 4. Applying theoretical frameworks to understand the complexities of interpersonal relationships in culturally heterogeneous contexts.

- 4. Analyzing the impact of non-verbal codes on the development of obstacles to competent intercultural communication.
- 5. Developing effective communication strategies that overcome obstacles to competent intercultural communication.
- 6. Applying theoretical frameworks to understand the complexities of obstacles to competent intercultural communication.
